## Meet Arlene

*After affordable housing, the greatest challenge seniors face is access to affordable transportation*



### AT A GLANCE

Arlene was living with financial fears in an unsafe apartment. After turning to SilverSource, she no longer struggles with living expenses, has an affordable home, a lifeline to friends and family, and can call for help at the push of a button.

### CHALLENGES

Arlene was spending over half of her monthly income on rent. Her living conditions were poor, and she injured herself after slipping on some ice on the sidewalk due to a poorly maintained gutter. With no one to help her, she managed to crawl back into her building and call for help. It was clear she needed an advocate, and her doctor referred her to SilverSource.

### SOLUTIONS

SilverSource worked with Arlene to secure more affordable safe housing, providing a security deposit, first month's rent and moving support. Her SilverSource social worker also provided her with a personal alert system and helped her obtain a subsidized cell phone to keep her connected to friends, family, and support services.

SilverSource helped Arlene acquire a government subsidized phone giving her an affordable lifeline to family, friends and resources at SilverSource.

## Meet Evelyn



### AT A GLANCE

Evelyn is a 66-year-old woman who recently had brain surgery. While caring for her husband who has dementia, she struggled with the costs of her prescriptions. SilverSource stepped in to cover the full cost of her medications and provided additional services for her and her husband.

### CHALLENGES

Evelyn needed to take blood thinners following brain surgery but found that she couldn't afford the cost of her medications and decided to halve her doses to save money. This trade off resulted in a stroke and her doctor insisted she complete the full 3-month treatment. John, her spouse, is unable to work due to dementia. While they waited for his social security benefits to begin, the couple was in a financial bind and turned to SilverSource for help.

### SOLUTIONS

SilverSource covered the cost of Evelyn's medication and also provided a walker for John and home care support. SilverSource social workers also connected them with a home care program and ensured that they had access to benefits they needed.

#### 3 Benefits Check-up


Our social work team ensures that each client receives a Benefits Check-up to ensure they are receiving services and benefits for which they are eligible.

## Meet Miguel



*“The Ride to Wellness has helped me save nearly \$500 in transportation costs.”*

### AT A GLANCE

Disabled after a recent amputation related to diabetes, Miguel, a veteran, needed help getting to and from dialysis appointments. SilverSource helps him with the Ride to Wellness transportation program, and provides him with healthy foods, which significantly stabilized his health.

### CHALLENGES

Miguel survived COVID-19, but now has serious kidney issues and requires dialysis. He needed assistance getting to and from his treatments as well as access to healthy foods for people with kidney disease. Miguel, who is reticent to ask for help, was also embarrassed to share problems he faced in his apartment which was infested with mice and roaches. It was clear he needed assistance and SilverSource stepped in to stabilize his living conditions and provide transportation to dialysis.

### SOLUTIONS

SilverSource helped Miguel get to and from his medical appointments, provided him with healthy, easy to prepare food each week. We helped to improve his living conditions with a plan of care that included housing applications and moving to a clean, safe, affordable home. His new apartment is well within his limited budget.

#### 1 Transportation

The ride to wellness removes transportation costs as a barrier to healthcare, preserving our passengers limited incomes for other basic needs.

#### 2 Safe Clean Housing

SilverSource paid for pest control services, advocated for Miguel and assisted him with applications for affordable, safe senior housing and moving costs.

#### 3 Food & Nutrition

Staff and volunteers prepare weekly groceries that are consistent with diabetic and renal care. A volunteer stops by each week to deliver nutritious, easy to make meals.

## Meet Lauren



### AT A GLANCE

Lauren is 73 and cannot drive due to acute diabetic retinopathy. Following the death of her brother, grocery shopping became impossible. Unable to drive and with no friends or family in the area, she felt lonely and hopeless. SilverSource was there to help with her nutritional needs, counseling, an emergency alert and transportation to get her to medical appointments.

### CHALLENGES

Lauren and Michael were siblings who looked out for each other. They enjoyed weekly visits and grocery shopping together. During the pandemic, Michael was referred to SilverSource by Stamford Hospital where he was having surgery. Sadly, he passed away, leaving no one to help care for Lauren, who felt increasingly isolated after the loss.

### SOLUTIONS

SilverSource provides a volunteer who shops weekly for Lauren, making sure there are nutritious, easy to prepare options. The volunteer calls and visits provide a consistent caring connection. The volunteer even created a "Silver Paws" fund to ensure that Lauren's cat is cared for as well!



## Bridging The Digital Divide

### Fostering Independence

In an ever-evolving digital world, where the internet is a bridge connecting communities and individuals, there exists a digital divide that often leaves senior citizens on the wrong side of the chasm. SilverSource is determined to help seniors bridge that digital divide and, by doing so, provide seniors with a renewed sense of connection, hope, and belonging.

### Getting Connected

The cornerstone of this program was a \$50,000 grant from the Southwestern Connecticut Agency on Aging (SWCAA) for a special project to provide broadband access to two senior housing sites, and to train seniors how to use computers safely and access online resources. SilverSource invested part of that to bring broadband connectivity to senior housing at Willard Manor and Harboursite.

### Laptops: The Keys to a Digital World

The computers are not just gadgets, but vehicles of connection to learning opportunities, family, and even healthcare.

### Training and Connection: Bridging Hearts

SilverSource provided laptops to residents along with a 14-week training program in English and Spanish, with a curriculum including how to use the laptop, navigate the Internet, access telehealth, make video calls, watch movies, shop online, and access training provided by the library and Stamford Senior Center. Going forward, we will use our new Lifelong Learning Laboratory to continue training initiatives.

### The Heartwarming Impact

The emotional impact of this program is immeasurable. Seniors who once felt isolated and disconnected now find themselves engaged in lively conversations with friends and family from afar. Loneliness has been replaced by a vibrant sense of community and ability.

### A Brighter Future

This program is not just about laptops and internet connections; it's about breathing life into our seniors' lives and making them feel seen in the digital world. It's about giving them the tools and support they need to thrive in a rapidly changing world and about making sure no one is left behind in the digital age.


